



**CCEF Condensed Rulebook & Quick Info
2019-2020**

MEMBERSHIP

Individual, Team/School, and Association Affiliation membership forms AND fees are due by September 17th, 2019.

Team/School Fee: \$250

Individual Membership Fee: \$5

Finals entry per class: \$75 Regular/\$90 Alumni

Tax included in all fees.

All fees are in Canadian Funds.

Teams/Schools should send all of their individual membership fees at once.

COLLECTING POINTS

Each association must make at least 5 shows per season available to all association members where they can collect CCEF points. In order to make a show CCEF qualified, the host school must be an affiliated member of the CCEF.

Riders may only collect points while holding an active CCEF membership. In the event that a rider did not purchase a CCEF membership prior to their first respective qualifying shows, they will be given the chance to register for a CCEF membership prior to their second show. Points will not be awarded from their first show.

QUALIFYING FOR FINALS

CCEF will take 7 riders from OCEA, 3 riders from AIEL, and 2 alumni riders per division, per class.

It is up to the association to choose their riders.

More information regarding alumni riders will be made available soon.

Associations must apply for their riders to compete by filling out the entry form found at <https://cancef.com/resources/> .



CCEF 2019-2020 Quick Info

Entry forms must include riders over all position at the end of the season, their results from respective association finals (if applicable), and the amount of CCEF points they have acquired throughout the season.

CCEF will then send out individual invitations to accepted riders.

FINALS FORMAT

CCEF Finals will offer an open, intermediate, novice, and entry division. Riders must be able to jump the qualifying height and must be qualified to compete in respective divisions as per their association's rulebooks.

The top score per horse over fences (4 horses) will be asked to return for a ride off round, conducted on one horse.

The flat will be run in one flight and a ride-off will be determined by the judge's discretion.
